IN MEMORIAM

Ann Pender Snyder

Having once been mistaken for the queen while touring Buckingham Palace, Ann Snyder might have had an uncanny resemblance in style and demeanor. But Ann was very much a product of the North Carolina roots and Southern culture she valued and served. Family, friends, this church, and the wider community lost a valued soul when Ann died peacefully, Thursday, October 31, 2024.

Ann Pender Snyder was born in Wilson, North Carolina, April 28, 1930. She graduated from Fayetteville Senior High School and Women's College (UNCG) in Greensboro, and after graduation married William David Snyder, Jr., in 1953. Together they made a warm and welcoming home in Greensboro and raised two girls, Pamela and Frances.

Homemaking and a period of working in the law offices of Major L. P. McLendon did not preclude Ann from community volunteerism in a variety of areas. Ann was deeply involved in Preservation Greensboro and Blandwood Museum, served on the boards of Preservation North Carolina and the North Carolina Museum of History, and was a dedicated volunteer at the Greensboro History Museum.

Politics was another interest. She was an important contributor to the campaign efforts of John F. Kennedy and subsequently was invited by Governor Hodges of North Carolina to meet Kennedy prior to his election. It was an extraordinary moment for Ann, making a lifelong cherished memory and one she thoroughly enjoyed sharing throughout her life.

She volunteered in the Intensive Care Unit at Cone Hospital for thirty years. She was active at West Market Street United Methodist Church and later at First Presbyterian, where she shared her leadership skills as an elder. She was a founding member of the Greensboro Opera Company and was social chairman of the Sedgefield Hunt. She was a member of the Wall Street Wizards investment club. Her love of reading, history, and the rich culture of the area led Ann to serve as member, then president and head trustee of the Historical Book Club of North Carolina.

Those who love Christmas gravitate to Christmas at Blandwood, and Ann was no exception. She loved creating Christmas stockings, playing tennis, traveling with her husband Bill, spending summers at Long Beach, cooking, knitting, seeing friends. She enjoyed enormously time spent with her grandchildren. Ann had a quick intelligence, a warm smile and a joyful greeting for all with whom she came in contact. Ann was much loved by all she met.

Ann's husband William Snyder predeceased her in 2015; she is survived by daughters Pamela Snyder Sessoms and husband Keith Valaer Sessoms; Frances Snyder Jones and husband Roland Manning Jones Jr.; and grandchildren Keith Valaer Sessoms Jr., Richard Carlton Parrish, Ann Pender Sessoms, Kyle Marie Novak and Roland Manning Jones, as well as many nieces and nephews. To them, Ann leaves a legacy of warmth, family values, and fond memories.

The Session of First Presbyterian Church offers expression of appreciation for the life well lived of Ann Pender Snyder. It offers deep condolences to her family and asks that this tribute be placed in its minutes.
